## Safe Journeys Safe Communities

#### Child development and road safety

Why are young children at risk around traffic?

#### Social/Emotional Development

Young children are

- · Sociable and want to be 'Where the action is'
- · All different, so what works with one child may not work with another

#### They also

· See themselves as 'big boys' or 'big girls' and want to do things by themselves



#### **Physical Development**

Young children are

- · Fast and can quickly move from safety into danger
- · Small and difficult for drivers to see, especially behind a reversing vehicle
- Still developing reflexes and reactions so stopping can take longer
- · Fragile so injuries are likely to be severe



#### Cognitive Development

Young children are

- · Curious and keen to explore and learn about their surroundings
- Yet to understand 'danger' and what to do to keep safe
- · Often easily distracted but can also be really focused on what is important to
- · Still developing their ability to judge the speed and distance of moving vehicles and what these
- Inexperienced as road users and can be confused by sudden changes in the traffic environment
- Still developing their understanding of sound and direction and what

- · Understand cause and effect differently to adults when in traffic
- · Interpret what they may see in their peripheral vision differently to adults
- . Can say safety words and slogans but are not vet able to apply them independently



Children's behaviour can't be explained in terms of just one developmental area It is the interaction of the cognitive, social/emotional and physical aspects of their development that puts young children at risk in and around traffic

Adults are responsible for the safety of young children!

#### '40' School Zone News:

We are often asked about being a '40' zone. We have been advised by the Traffic Engineer at Council that we cannot have a designated '40' zone immediately around the Preschool.

This is because children at Preschool are accompanied by parents/adults at all times when coming to/leaving Preschool.

On the other hand, children at school are walking unaccompanied into or away from school to buses, cars, etc. This is why it is called a School Zone and applicable only around schools.

In 2019 Council renewed the School Zone & Holding Hands sign to increase the road safety for our precious Preschoolers.

#### **Bush Preschool:**

We are starting our first rotation of the Bush Preschool Program on 2nd April .... Watch out for the email, permission slip & roster so you know when your child will be an Adventurer.
